The **Friends of St Michael's Church** set up a group to manage our appeal with a target of £15k to be raised within six months. The basic framework was to obtain sponsorship for all the elements of the carved medieval N aisle ceiling. These elements were made up of 96 panels, 24 angels and 6 roof bosses, with sponsorship values ranging from £100 pounds for a panel to £250 for a roof boss. The aim was to complete this matrix through individual / local organization / business sponsorship, and fundraising events.

Major fundraising events

September - A Night at the Movies was organised by the Parish Hall Committee and featured Brian Freestone delivering a talk on film musical scores. John Page provided the technical wizardry through video clips. Brian covered a wide range of movies and came to the conclusion that Ennio Morricone was the top rated film music composer of all time. Never heard of him? Well, think of the Good, the Bad and the Ugly, a Fistful of Dollars and the Mission...

October - Raise the Roof - Colin Townsend turned impresario and provided us with a wonderful evening's entertainment under the banner of Raise the Roof. The U3A Ukulele Band from Burnham set the scene with a series of numbers based on hits of the 1950s, and this was followed by Simply Squeezers, a local accordion band, who took us onto the streets of Paris with a series of evocative numbers. But, topping the bill, the Burnham Rock Choir really did 'Raise the Roof' with a rousing performance of rock songs accompanied by all the appropriate hand and body movements. One doubts whether the church has ever been witness to such a rousing performance in its eight hundred years.
